The play follows both Albert and Joey during their war experiences.

Including the life-sized puppet, Joey, who is controlled by three puppeteers. These puppeteers control all of Joey's actions, one controls the head and ears; another controls the breathing and front legs; and a third controls the hind legs and tail.
